Preliminary Announcement(s):

- Lenny Coll – Voiced his concerns about moving Student Government meeting take over to Thursday the 16th. Mayor Brennan explained his reasoning around changing the student take over meeting. There were discussions about the school visitations and the possibility of moving the meeting and/or not.
- Manager Joe Varhola announced Munhall Girls Softball season to begin April 27th at 11am and advised of the Sustainable Pittsburgh meeting to be held at the Forest Hills Borough building Monday, April 15th at 5:30pm. There was discussion about Munhall Baseball season beginning April 28th, but no time was mentioned.

- James Fulton – Homestead American Legion Post 60 – Mr. Fulton wanted to introduce himself and make Council aware of their presence in our area.

Council Item(s):

- Generator – Manager Varhola made Council aware that Penn Power will be coming to work on the generator for \$1700.

- Demo – Abatement - Mr. Varhola stated there has been an advertisement for bids for the abatement and demo of Willis Center. The bids will be opened April 17th, 2019. There was a depth discussion between Mayor Brennan, Joe Varhola and Council regarding the process recommended by the Borough Engineer and the bid process.

Additional Item(s):

- Mayor Brennan passed out and discussed livestock ordinances he received from South Park Township and asked that Council use these as a example to adopt an ordinance for Munhall. He then passed out a sample newsletter and asked that Council consider one for Munhall. He also wanted to make Council aware the Pump House is building a museum in the Waterfront, next to the Pump House. They are applying for grant money to do so. He then asked Council to keep the boroughs Waterfront property.
